of construction on the NCRTD's \$17 million Operations and
Maintenance Facility in Taos, New Mexico

The Blue Bus current Taos operations and maintenance facility is being upgraded to accommodate our growing needs to provide safe, effective, and efficient transit service for the greater Taos area. The current facility has become outdated and is too small to accommodate the current fleet and other service improvements planned for the Taos area. The facility will include 7,200 square feet of administrative space and 10,800 square feet of maintenance space. The site will include administrative offices, employee support facilities such as training rooms, locker rooms, a wellness space, vehicle maintenance and repair bays, a fueling station and potential future workforce housing.


