


Time to push for sales tax vote to support Ozark Regional Transit, officials say

Ozark Regional Transit officials said Thursday they need to go to voters in the four major cities sooner rather than later with a proposal for a dedicated sales tax to pay for expanding public transit.

"I believe it's really time for us to push forward with this," said Joel Gardner, executive director. "I think that if we wait another year, a

concept of catch-up will never really occur. We'll be so far behind anything that we do will be taxed. Our performance levels will be taxed to the limits on a regular basis. We re operating at 100% of vehicle usage right now." Read More



RTA wants to put commuter rail project before Oklahoma City, Edmond and Norman voters

The Regional Transportation Authority of Central Oklahoma would like to bring a ballot referendum before Oklahoma City, Edmond and Norman voters in either fall 2024 or spring 2025 to fund its proposed rail commuter project, RTA representatives told the Edmond City Council on April 24. Jason Ferbrache, the interim executive director of RTA, said Burlington Northern Santa Fe has shown a willingness to share its right of way for the project, which would travel through each of the member cities along the north-south corridor. The project, which faces unanswered questions about its total cost to RTA member cities, will ultimately need an access agreement with BNSF to be completed. Read More
